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About Erasmus +

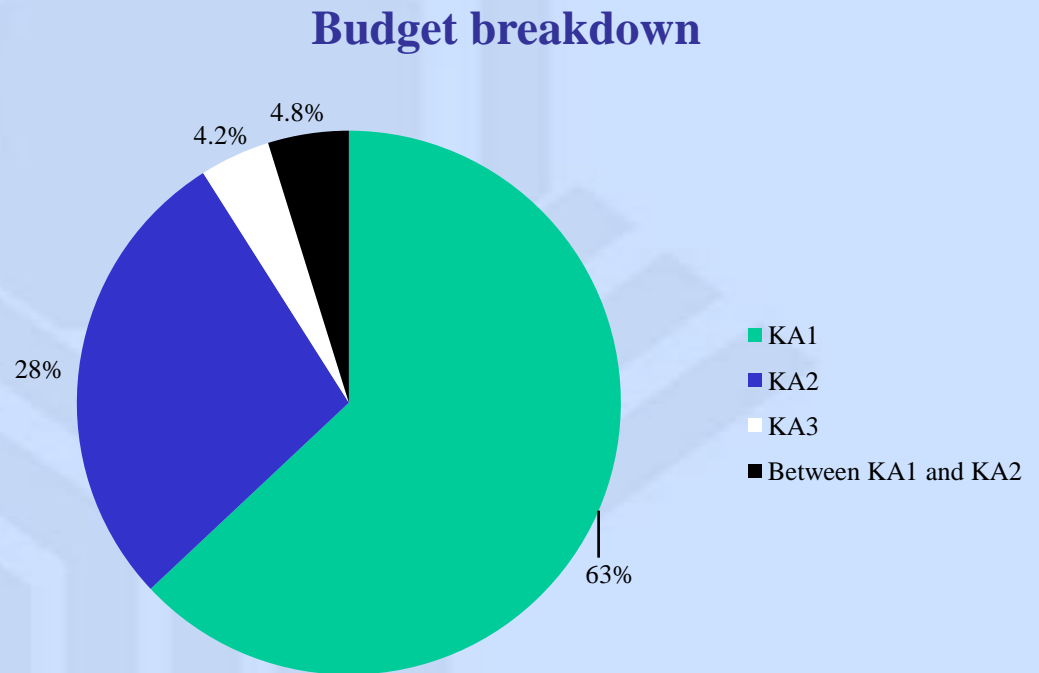
- Combines 7 EU education, training and youth programmes, and introduces sport for the first time
- Total budget of **€14.7 billion**, representing a 40% budget increase
- Increased learning opportunities abroad for students and teachers
- EU grants and training for about 4 million people and 125,000 institution

- 800,000 educators and youth workers will acquire new teaching and learning methods abroad

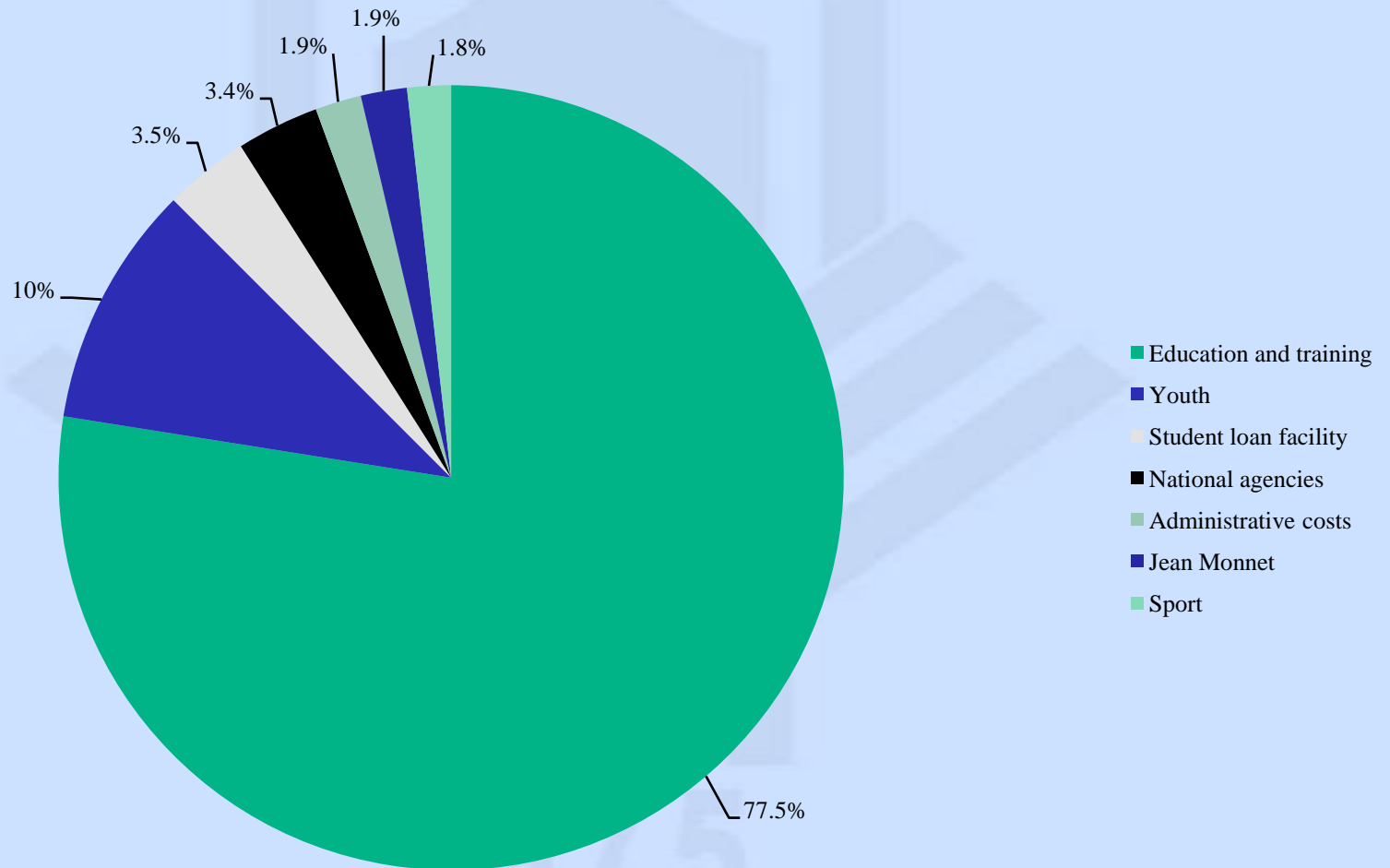
Jean Monnet

- Over 100 Centres of Excellence will be supported around the world

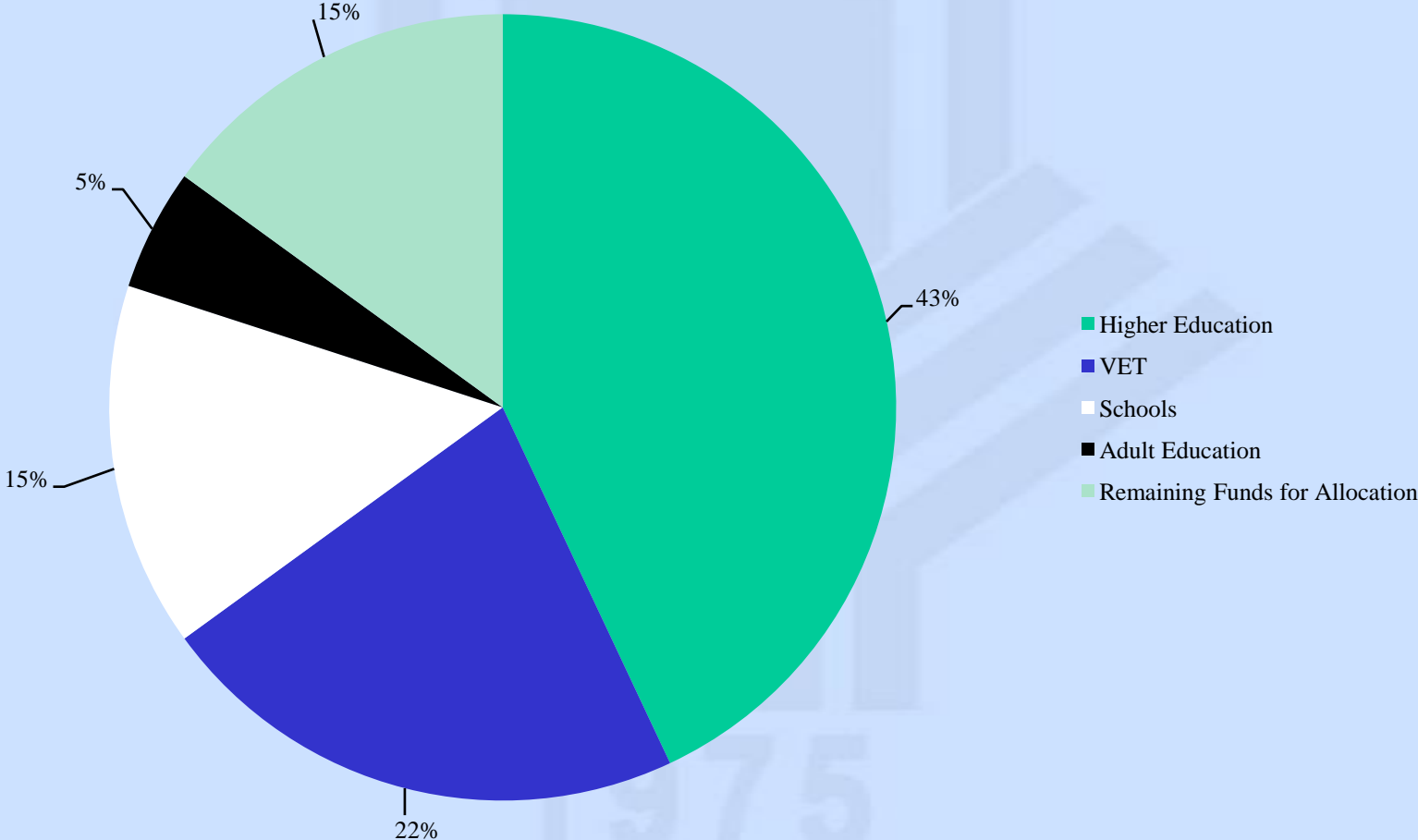
Sport

Higher education: main objectives

- Increase the **skills** and **employability** of students and contribute to the competitiveness of European economy
- Improve **quality** in **teaching** and **learning**
- Implement the **Higher Education Modernization strategy** in programme countries and raise the capacity of partner countries
- Streamline the **international dimension** in Erasmus+
- Support the **Bologna process** and **policy dialogues** with strategic partner countries

Key Action 1: Student mobility in HE (1)

Aims:

- Provide **more** and **better** opportunities to increase skills and competences of HE students, **attract** the best talents from abroad

Main activities:

- **Credit mobility**, including traineeships abroad: mobility for studies opened to partner countries in both directions (*NEW*)
- **Degree mobility**: excellent Joint Master courses offered by universities from Europe and in some cases partner countries attracting the very best students worldwide
- **Student loan guarantee (*NEW*)**: to boost Master's degree mobility within Europe

Key Action 1: Staff mobility in HE (2)

Aims:

- Provide **more** and **better** opportunities for an increased quality in teaching and learning

Main activities:

- **Teaching assignment:** to develop innovative teaching methods, mobility opened to partner countries in both directions (*NEW*)
- **Professional development:** to improve skills and competences of both academic and non-academic staff, opened to partner countries in both direction (*NEW*)
- **Invited staff from enterprise:** to increase the relevance of curricula

Key Action 2: Cooperation for innovation (2)

Capacity building in HE

Main activities: 2 types of projects with Neighbouring and Enlargement countries, Russia, Asia, Latin America, Africa, Caribbean, Pacific (ACP)

- **Joint projects:** New curricula & degrees, learning and teaching methodologies, staff development, quality assurance, governance, Bologna tools
- **Structural projects:** Reforms at national level with support of authorities in Partner Countries (policy modernization, Bologna policies, governance and management of higher education systems...)
- + **Additional mobility component** for ENP and Enlargement countries (without National Agency): students and staff, to and from EU, same rules as for credit mobility (max. 12 months)

Bosnia and Herzegovina within the Erasmus+

- **Key Action 1 - Joint Master Degrees** (ex- Erasmus Mundus Action1)
 - a) **At institutional level**, BiH and other countries neighbouring the EU can be partners in consortia with EU universities. The consortium coordinator applies to Call and if selected, EC will fund it. It provides joint degree programme in all partner institutions and launches search for giving scholarships to students/scholars.
 - b) **At individual level**, students and staff from BiH have access to all existing and future European Joint Masters/Doctoral programmes (but this is a worldwide competition).

 - This is a centralized action, managed by EACEA in Brussels. The Call was opened till 27 March for institutions.

Bosnia and Herzegovina within the Erasmus+

- **Key Action 1 - Credit mobility** (ex- Erasmus Mundus Action 2)
- This is the opening up of the previous only intra-EU Erasmus mobility to the neighbours. In order for individuals to participate in this, BiH universities have to sign partnership agreements with European universities with which they can have exchanges of staff and students.
- This action will be managed by National Agencies of programme countries (EU mainly).
- **The Call is not opened yet for this kind of mobility for partner countries (BiH). The Call is expected later in 2014 (probably in September)**

Bosnia and Herzegovina within the Erasmus+

- **Key Action 2 – Capacity building (ex- Tempus)**
- BiH universities (as well as those in Western Balkans or other neighbouring countries) can be partners or applicants in this type of projects.
- This is a centralized action managed by EACEA in Brussels.
- **The Call is expected later in 2014 (probably in September)**
- **Jean Monnet**
- It supports teaching of the European integration subjects. It is opened to the whole world. BiH institutions can participate.
- The Call was opened till 26 March

Visit the funding page for application details and forms http://eacea.ec.europa.eu/erasmus-plus/funding_en

- Register all partners in a proposal within the participants portal
- Complete the electronic application form and attach the required annexes
- Submit the electronic application

Institutions: What happens next?

- All proposals are assessed by independent experts
- Proposals are ranked according to their assessed quality
- All candidates are informed, and results are published
- Contracts are prepared for successful projects
- The best proposals are selected for funding by EC
