JoinEU-SEE>PENTA is a scholarship scheme for mobility between the EU and the Western Balkans, funded within the Erasmus Mundus 2009-2013 programme. Scholarships are available for students (undergraduate, master, doctoral and post-doctoral) and staff (academic and administrative). Please note, however, that not every call covers all levels of mobility (see below).

The objective of the JoinEU-SEE>PENTA partnership is to foster understanding and mutual enrichment between the EU and the third countries in higher education and society at large by

- supporting the development of individuals' qualifications and international experience;
- promoting the academic mobility of excellent third-country students, academics and researchers, in particular from vulnerable groups;
- enhancing the international cooperation capacity of the partner institutions by sharing good practice and expertise in the organization of academic mobility.

Who can apply?

Students and staff members of all partner universities, both from EU and Western Balkan countries, as well as nationals of any EU country and the Western Balkan partner countries.

Scholarships and duration

Scholarships include monthly subsistence allowance, travel and visa costs, insurance, and tuition fees (if applicable).

At the second call for applications* scholarships for the following levels of mobility are available:
